Progress so far

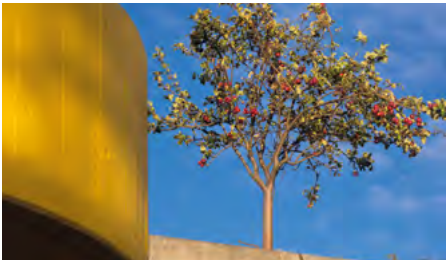
We're making significant strides towards a greener, fairer neighbourhood through local partnerships and impactful initiatives



Lambeth Palace is improving energy efficiency with new solar panels, electric vehicle charging points, and an Energy Centre replacing gas boilers with renewable heat pumps.



South Bank BID has installed eight air quality sensors in high-footfall areas, with data being used to assess interventions and promote the healthiest walking routes.



South Bank and Waterloo Neighbours, WeAreWaterloo and **Lambeth Council** have allocated £30,000 to planting new trees, with community volunteers helping to water each tree weekly for three years.



WeAreWaterloo has provided recycling services to over 200 businesses, achieving a recycling rate of 70% or higher within the BID area.

Work underway

We're working on projects designed to further reduce emissions, enhance our natural environment and strengthen our community



Establishing a heat network: an underground pipe system distributing low-emission heat for energy intensive buildings.



Improving air quality by promoting walking, cycling and green deliveries.



Planting new trees, expanding local greening and providing a community toolkit to promote further action.



Providing information and advice, sharing best practices and highlighting successful actions across the neighbourhood.
